### We've Moved!

These will be available before the start of the 2011 nesting season.

U.S. Senator Olympia Snowe made a surprise visit to the building in conjunction with the Lobster Festival Parade in Rockland in August. She walked the parade route, and we were able to provide her convenient parking at the new building so she could pick up her car at the end of the parade. We gave her a tour of the new building and talked with her at length about seabird conservation and the positive impact that healthy seabird colonies have on Maine's economy. She was favorably impressed and most gracious.

## Fourth Annual Seabird and Island Adventure Cruise

Our annual Seabird Island Cruise, on August 1, was a huge success! The trip sold out again, and over 100 people enjoyed blue skies and calm seas. We visited Eastern Egg Rock, Franklin Island National Wildlife Refuge, and other islands in Muscongus Bay, and saw plenty of puffins, terns, gulls, and even a peregrine falcon. Biologists from the Maine Coastal Island NWR, Maine Inland Fisheries & Wildlife, and the National Audubon Society's Seabird Restoration Program helped with species identification and gave us their perspectives on seabird management challenges and research.



## Grant Funds New Tabletop Display

The National Wildlife Refuge Association grant last year allowed us to produce a new tabletop display. The completed display was used at the Friends Conference in West Virginia, the Maine Land Trust Conference, and the Maine Boats, Homes and Harbors Show in Rockland in August.
